

ABOUT TDOR - 20 NOVEMBER

"The Transgender Day of Remembrance was set aside to memorialize those who were killed due to anti-transgender hatred or prejudice. The event is held in November to honour Rita Hester, whose murder on November 28th, 1998 kicked off the "Remembering Our Dead" web project and a San Francisco candlelight vigil in 1999. Although not every person represented during the Day of Remembrance self-identified as transgender — that is, as a transsexual, crossdresser, or otherwise gender-variant —

each was a victim of violence based on bias against transgender people.

We live in times more sensitive than ever to hatred based violence... Yet even now, the deaths of those based on anti-transgender hatred or prejudice are largely ignored. Over the last decade, more than one person per month has died due to transgender-based hate or prejudice, regardless of any other factors in their lives. This is not abating. The Transgender Day of Remembrance serves several purposes. It raises public awareness of hate crimes against transgender people, an action current media doesn't perform. It publicly mourns and honours the lives of those who might otherwise be forgotten. We express love and respect for our people in face of national indifference and hatred. This Day reminds non-transgender people we are their sons, daughters, parents, friends and lovers. It gives our allies a chance to step forward with us and stand in vigil, memorializing those of us who've died by anti-transgender violence." Graham Howell writes: "A client of Graham Howell's, a single mother with daughter aged 11, has become homeless due to a reduction in her income support following decisions of Work and Income have made. She does have temporary emergency accommodation - one small bedroom but needs more suitable accommodation. In effect the Work and Income decision won't be resolved for weeks, possibly months and certainly won't get back in her previous home. The mother is a full-time student (Massey) and is flexible about where she can live.. Newtown, Mt Cook, Te Aro, Mt Victoria, Thorndon or the central city, and can afford up to \$350 rent per week. She has excellent references from previous landlords, is a non-smoker. Graham can provide contact details."
