



New World New God, a collection of Ian Harris's columns dating back to 2001, was published in 2018 by Mākaro Press and well received by both readers and reviewers. Never one to shy away from controversy, Ian retains the considered and singular approach he is known for in his second book. He writes in Hand in Hand:

'Outmoded understandings of the cosmos, nature and the supernatural must be set aside and cornerstone concepts rethought in terms of the huge expansion in every sphere of knowledge over the past four centuries. New World New God assumed this new worldview as the only valid platform for Christianity in the West today. Hand in Hand delves deeper into why such a transposition is necessary.'

lan examines this new orientation first in relation to how humanity and divinity can coexist and blend within a secular worldview, then positions it with regard to an issue that cannot be ignored in our modern world – the relationship to science (often considered to be the 'enlightened alternative' to religion), also care for the environment amidst climate change and overpopulation, and implications for the churches. As Ian says, '[This evolution] is happening on the boundaries: it needs to happen in the mainstream, too.'

Hand in Hand will be released in May 2021.
