The contemporary reading is a quote from an interview with Alok Vaid-Menon. They were responding to a question about how they practice joy during a time when there is a lot of fear and grief.

The first is learning history, because we have this deep need to pretend as if everything is unprecedented, and it's just not true. There have been so many people before us who have felt that same sense of despair, and I'm deeply curious about what they did with their despair, and how they navigated lives and societies that told them that they shouldn't exist. I take so much hope, especially during pride, from the legacy of my trans ancestors, my trancestors. Imagine knowing you that you'd be arrested going outside... and going outside anyways. Imagine being arrested 20-40 times, and still going outside. Imagine the kinds of every day brutality, and yet, the self-knowledge it took, to continue to go outside, as my trancestors did. And so I tell myself, OK, why did they do it? The only probable reason that they could do it, is because they loved me. Because they wanted to create a world where no one had to suffer like they did. And they birthed that possibility for me, so I have to do it for the next gen, and I have to really fight to make sure that no one else has to experience this pain. That's what gives me hope. History informs my future.

WIDER CHURCH AND COMMUNITY NOTICES

CHRISTIAN WORLD SERVICE LAUNCHES GAZA PALESTINE EMERGENCY APPEAL

Christian World Service has launched an <u>emergency appeal</u> to assist people who have been affected by the current conflict in the Middle East, particularly Gaza.

Thousands of people have been killed, injured and displaced. Nearly two hundred people are being held as hostages. Hospitals including the Al Ahli Arab Hospital, schools and homes have been damaged or destroyed. The need for a ceasefire and humanitarian relief is overwhelming.

"The people of Gaza are living in harrowing conditions with limited resources, and we cannot stand idly by while they suffer... Our collective efforts can make a significant difference in the lives of those trapped in this nightmarish situation," DSPR.

Funds raised will meet some of the urgent needs of people through our long term partner the Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees (DSPR). In Gaza, DSPR is providing shelter, food and support to people who have fled the north and who have lost homes. Some churches are hosting Muslim and Christian families from the community. Together they have secured some food supplies, but more will be needed in the months ahead.

DSPR runs three health clinics, vocational training programmes and provides emergency assistance in Gaza. Tragically staff have lost homes and family members. The main office building in Gaza City was severely damaged. Critical medical supplies were stored at the site. DSPR also runs programmes providing emergency relief, education, livelihood support and medical care in Jordan, Lebanon, Nazareth and the West Bank.

CWS is supporting the **call** for an immediate ceasefire and access for humanitarian relief.

DSPR is an integral part of the local community. It is preparing to help many more people as soon as it practically can with:

- food
- hygiene kits
- shelter
- medications and medical treatment
- · psychosocial support

RELIEFAID APPEAL FOR GAZA


We held back from asking for your support until we knew we could get emergency aid on the ground. We have solved this problem, now we need your help to get aid to families who have nowhere to run.

This is a totally free event for Rainbow Wellington Members. With limited spaces, registration is a must - this event will sell out!



Tongariro National Park, an Artist's Field Guide

Desmond Bovey in conversation with Jane Westaway Unity Books Wellington, 57 Willis St. Tuesday 21st November, 12.30-1.30 pm ALL WELCOME

When queer author Desmond Bovey returned to his native New Zealand after thirty years in France, he felt a need to reconnect with the landscapes of his youth. He chose Tongariro National Park, inspired by a chance encounter with a kārearea, the New Zealand falcon.

He returned again and again, sketchbook in hand, applying his delicate brush as he reacquainted himself with the dramatic landforms and ecology of the volcanic plateau.

This exquisite book is the result. With 400 illustrations and an informative yet accessible text, Bovey deconstructs the park's amazing landscapes, giving us not only scenery but the bones beneath. His illustrations present Tongariro's stunning landscapes in relation to the plants and animals that live there, describing the ways they fit together and depend upon each other for survival in an often harsh and inhospitable environment.

Tongariro National Park is a field guide of rare quality, combining the highest quality of information with superb illustration, a treasure for anyone who loves these wonderful landscapes.
